



November 4, 1804 Toussaint Charbonneau, a French trapper meets with Lewis and Clark at the Mandan Villages, near present-day Washburn, North Dakota. He told them he could bring his Shoshone wife Sacagawea to serve as guide and interpreter. Sacagawea became a key member of the expedition, helping the Corps of Discovery secure horses from the Shoshone to cross the uncharted Continental Divide.

Minot – At the junction of US 83 and US 2, has an array of attractions including the Dakota Territory Museum, Eastwood Park National Historic District, the Lillian and Coleman Taube Museum of Art, Magic City Express at the Roosevelt Park Zoo, Northwest Art Center, Old Soo Depot Transportation Museum, the Railroad Museum of Minot, the Ward County Historical Society Museum, plus the Scandinavian Heritage Park and the Riverwalk of Minot along the Souris River. Carpio – On US 52 is Gateway to the Upper Souris Natural Wildlife Refuge.

Kenmare – On US 52 features the Danish Mill, a working reproduction of an Old World Windmill, plus the Des Lac National Wildlife Refuge Scenic Byway, the Lake County Historical Museum and the Vand R Toy Museum.

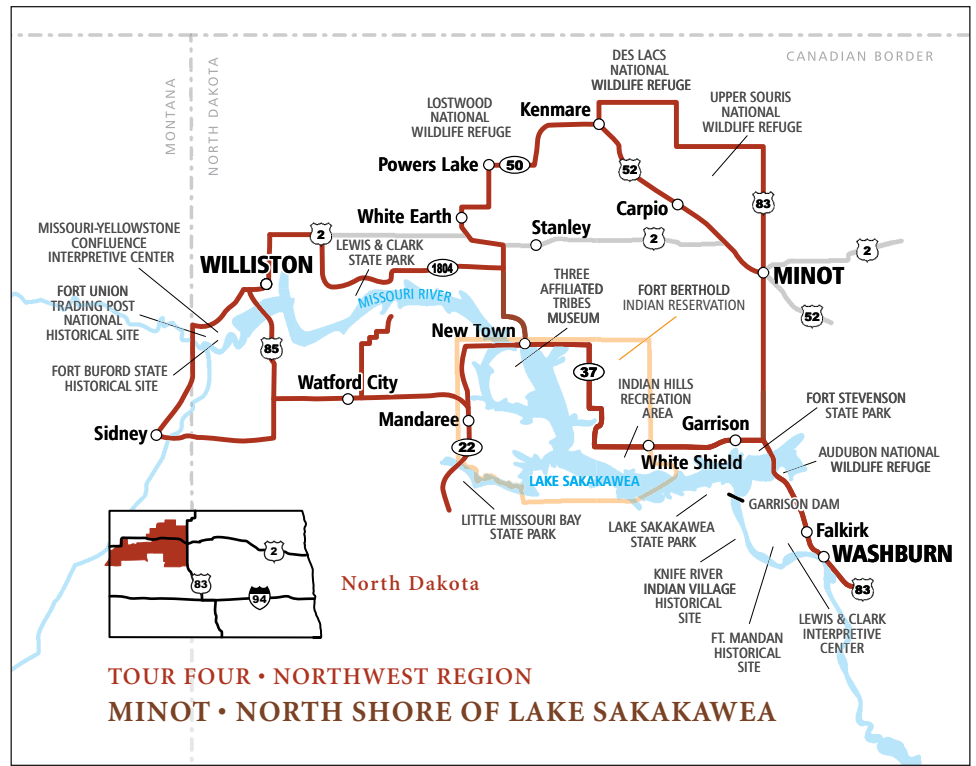
Powers Lake – On ND 50 hosts visitors to the Powers Lake Historical Museum complex which features an historic depot station, homestead houses, a Methodist church and blacksmith shop. The Lostwood National Wildlife Refuge is north of the community.

Stanley – On US 2 features the Flickertail Village and Museum. The pioneer village includes 18 restored old west buildings plus what many consider as the “best” ice cream around.

White Earth – Off of US 2, is the site of the White Earth Bay Recreation Area which includes RV sites, electric, fish-cleaning stations and concession.

Lewis and Clark State Park – On ND 1804 on Lake Sakakawea features 192 campsites, rural cabins, a group complex, indoor meeting facilities, marina, boat ramps, boat and canoe rentals.

Williston – US 2/US 85, ND 1804. Area attractions include the Frontier Museum complex which includes a rural church, restored depot, a depot taxi and a country school. For more information, go to: www.visitwilliston.com.



Fort Union Trading Post National Historic Site – Near Williston on ND 1804 at the North Dakota/Montana border. The Fort Union Trading Post was the principal trading post of the American Fur Company. The restored fort and the nearby Fort Buford State Historical Site and the Missouri-Yellowstone Confluence Interpretive Center bring alive the days of the fur trade near the confluence of the Missouri and Yellowstone rivers.

Watford City – South of Williston on US 85 is the Gateway to the North Unit of Theodore Roosevelt National Park. The 13-mile Scenic Byway and Park Visitor Center are off of US 85. The Byway includes overlooks, trails and pullouts where visitors can view the spectacular Badlands, and the bison and wildlife that abound there. Watford City features the Long X Trading Post Visitor Center, McKenzie County Heritage Park and Pioneer Museum. For more information, go to: www.4eyes.com.

Mandaree – On ND 23 near Lake Sakakawea features the nearby Hale Marina campground, boat ramp and dock, the McKenzie Bay campground with 27 RV sites, 63 electric, RV station and restaurant and Skunk Bay campground with boat ramps.

New Town – On ND 23 features Four Bears Memorial Park, the Four Bear Bridge, the Three Affiliated Tribes Museum and an earth Lodge Village on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation. For more information on the Three Affiliated Tribes, please go to: www.mhanation.com.

White Shield – Indian Hills State Recreation Area south of White Shield provides cabin rental, visitor center, picnic shelters, boat ramps, fishing boat and canoe rentals, hiking and biking trails and horseback riding.

Lake Sakakawea State Park – South of Emmett, offers 192 campsites, cabin rental, visitor center, marina, picnic shelters, boat ramps, fishing boat and canoe rentals.

Fort Stevenson State Park – West of Garrison. Includes boat ramps, fishing boat rental, boat storage, 175 campsites, cabin rental, visitor center and picnic shelters.

Garrison – On ND 37. Features the Harrison Park Museum and the North Dakota Firefighters Museum plus the World’s Largest Walleye statue.

Drive north to Minot or south to Bismarck on US 83.
