



You and your family can enjoy your own Lewis and Clark Trail adventure and experience the splendor of Glacier National Park!

Missoula – On I-90/U.S. 93 features nine historic districts, live theatre and music venues, shopping boutiques, the Smokejumper Visitor Center, the Historic Museum at Fort Missoula, the Montana Museum of Art and Culture, the Missoula Art Museum and the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation Center. Caras Park in downtown Missoula features kayakers riding the waves on the Clark Fork River.

Lewis and Clark historic sites south of Missoula on US 12 include Travelers' Rest State Park, Lolo Hot Springs, Lolo Pass Visitor Center and Lolo Trail National Historic Landmark.

Seeley Lake – On US 83. The town of Seeley Lake is an outdoor adventure lover's paradise with a number of recreation outfitters to provide all the gear to enjoy the nearby trails, lakes and streams, the Lolo National Forest and Bob Marshall Wilderness.

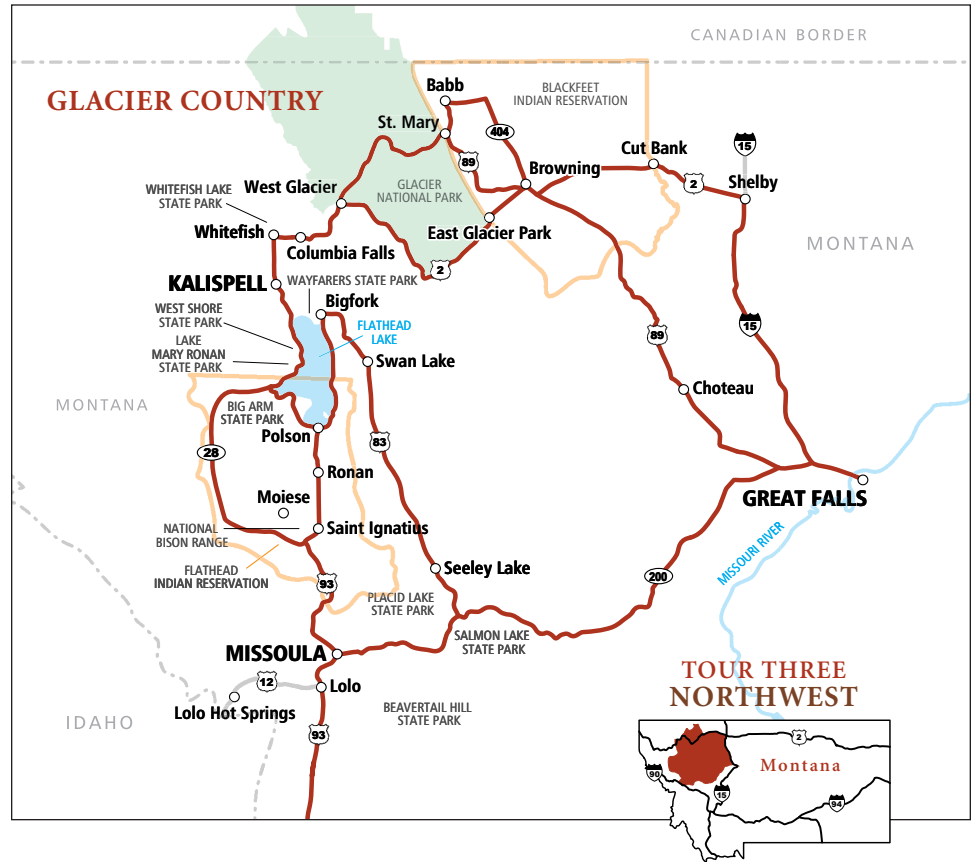
Flathead Indian Reservation – Home of the Salish, Kootenai and Pend d'Oreille Tribes is located north of Missoula. Notable attractions include the National Bison Range near Moiese, St. Ignatius Mission, Ninepipes Museum of Early Montana in Charlo, Polson-Flathead Historical Museum and Miracle of America Museum in Polson and The People's Center in Pablo. Flathead Lake – Kerr Dam is located on the south end of Flathead Lake – the largest natural freshwater lake in the West. The Kerr Dam overlook offers spectacular canyon views of the 204-foot dam and its falls. Six state parks are located on this 200-square-mile lake, including Wild Horse Island – a day-use park that is accessible via kayak.

Bigfork – Located on the north end of Flathead Lake and accessible on MT 83 or MT 35. Bigfork offers convenient access to the lake and nearby Flathead National Forest. Bigfork is recognized as one of the best small art towns in the U.S. and features 16 galleries, live theater and 25 restaurants.

Kalispell – The historic downtown district has fine dining, local studios and galleries, as well as the Conrad Mansion, the Hockaday Museum of Art, and the Museum at Central School.

Whitefish – On beautiful Whitefish Lake at the base of Big Mountain. Located 30 minutes west of Glacier National Park, the town of Whitefish features the Whitefish Mountain Resort and an array of attractions, shops, events and a vibrant downtown.



Columbia Falls – Located on US 2 en route to Glacier National Park, Columbia Falls has a revitalized downtown and provides access to the Flathead River.

Glacier National Park – Visitors can journey off the Lewis and Clark Trail to see 1-million acres of scenic splendor. The Park's high-mountain vistas, glacier-fed lakes, shimmering waterfalls and an estimated 25 active glaciers attract people the world over. There are 734 miles of hiking trails. Driving the Going-to-the-Sun Road over high-mountain vistas will take your breath away. Elk, grizzly bears, mountain goats, and bighorn sheep thrive within the park. Visitors can stay at classic chalets including Granite Park and Sperry Chalets or the Many Glacier Lodge east of Babb, the Lake McDonald Lodge north of West Glacier and the Glacier Park Lodge adjoining the Park on the Blackfoot Indian Reservation. The communities of West Glacier, East Glacier Park, St. Mary and Essex also provide a variety of lodging, recreation, and dining services, plus a number of events and activities. The Going-to-the-Sun Road travels through the heart of the park and over Logan Pass, connecting West Glacier and St. Mary. US 2 connects West Glacier

with East Glacier Park along the southern border of the park. For more info, go to: www.nps.gov/glac

Browning – On the Blackfoot Indian Reservation. Includes the Blackfoot Heritage Center and Art Gallery and the Museum of the Plains Indian. The Blackfeet were the Native Americans who Meriwether Lewis met when he led a small party by horseback into Blackfoot Country to explore the Marias River on his return journey in 1806. Great Falls – One of the eastern gateways to the Rocky Mountain Front and Glacier National Park is via US 89. The Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail Interpretive Center portrays the epic challenges the Corps of Discovery faced in the portage of the five great falls on the Missouri River.
